Clatsop ARES Net Control Script

This A.R.E.S. Net is brought to you by the Clatsop County's Auxiliary Communications Group and is supported by Clatsop County Emergency Management. We meet every Monday evening at 7:00 p.m. pacific time on the Sunset Empire Amateur Radio Club repeater network serving the northwest coast of Oregon and southern Washington.
This is a directed net requiring all stations to go through net control. Net Control for this evening is [call sign], and my location is
For any emergency requiring this frequency or help, please say "break," followed by your call sign. I will suspend the net, and offer our assistance, until you advise you are clear. Before we begin, is there any emergency traffic? (PAUSE: release mic PTT button)
Our purpose is to drill in emergency net communication procedures. All licensed amateurs are welcome to check in when your home location is called. Please note: This net operates through multiple linked repeaters and requires at least a two-second delay between pressing your Talk button and speaking. We allow extra time for EchoLink stations.
If the repeater network is down, or if net control so directs, please use the alternate Wickiup repeater frequency 146.66 MHz, PL tone 118.8 (AuxComm channel 14). If that unlinked repeater fails, we will immediately move to the simplex frequency 147.580 MHz (AuxComm channel 3). Please monitor the entire net unless you must request an early out. (PAUSE: release mic PTT button)
Net Control will call for stations in Clatsop County first, followed by Pacific County and then all other areas. Please check in with your call sign using ITU phonetics, then your name, your home location, and your traffic status. If you are mobile, checking in via EchoLink, or visiting another area, please check in when your home area is called as we work from a list of areas and documented participants in that area.
Once again, tonight's net control station is My name is and (traffic status).

Before we begin with check-ins by geographic area, are there any stations requesting an early out?

Are there any stations who need to contact those stations requesting an early out?

I will now take station check-ins by area beginning with: (Warrenton and Hammond - Move on through remaining areas as per roster.)

(When all areas have checked in:)

Are there any late, missed or visitor station check-ins? To help us locate you on our roster, please announce your home location first, then your call sign.

(Afterward, call on any check-ins who had announcements)

Are there any other stations with announcements, traffic, or requests for contacts?
